RHI NAMES SIDNEY NORTON NEW CHIEF FINANCIAL OFFICER

Public invited to Sept. 17 open house to welcome new CFO

(Indianapolis, Ind.) – Rehabilitation Hospital of Indiana (RHI) today announced that Sidney P. Norton of Indianapolis has joined its team as the new chief financial officer (CFO).

Norton most recently served as CFO for the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA). During his two-year tenure with FSSA, he led the development and passage of the agency's \$14 billion biennial budget for Medicaid and social services. He also oversaw the modeling and forecasting for the state's new insurance product, the Healthy Indiana Plan, established a department-wide accounting system, and led a staff of 150. Prior to his position with FSSA, Norton was the director of the state's Office of Management and Budget.

"Sidney brings exactly the right kind of experience to RHI," said Denny Armington, RHI's chief executive officer. "He's no stranger to the 'ins and outs' of Medicaid, not to mention health care facilities' financial priorities and needs.

"There's no doubt he will lead our financial team well, and we're excited to have him on board," Armington added.

Norton's health care experience also includes senior positions in financial management, business development and public policy with Eli Lilly and Company in Indianapolis. He received his bachelor's degree from Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah, and his master's in Business Administration from the Kelley School of Business at Indiana University-Bloomington. He is active in his Indianapolis neighborhood as a board member for an urban charter school, and he is a YMCA group cycling instructor.

The public is invited to attend an open house on Sept. 17, from 3 to 5 p.m., to welcome Norton to RHI. The event will be held at the RHI-Main Campus at 4141 Shore Dr. in Indianapolis. No RSVP is required.
